Guidelines on

Establishment of Goat Rearing Clusters

Goat rearing is widely recognized as a sustainable and profitable livelihood option for rural communities. Goats provide a reliable source of income, especially for small and marginal farmers, landless labourers, and women. They offer multiple products like meat, milk, skin, fibre, and manure and require relatively low investment and maintenance, making them ideal for cluster-based promotion. Also in rural economies, goats play a significant role, especially in dryland and rain-fed areas, making it a viable enterprise.

I. Objectives

- a. To assist small, marginal and landless SHG members to take up goat rearing as a profitable livelihood activity.
- b. To support SHG women members by providing them with training, technical assistance, infrastructure and financial support for taking up goat rearing on a collective approach.
- c. Reduces the cost of rearing goats by bulk procuring of feed materials and increases the profit through collective marketing of goat.

II. Selection of Districts

- a. All districts have been selected based on the significant presence of traditional goat rearing practices, particularly in rural and semi-arid regions.
- b. The climatic conditions in most parts of the state especially in dryland and rain-fed area are well-suited for low-cost, open or semi-shed goat rearing models. The manageable weather helps reduce disease risk and supports year-round operations.

c. Districts with established local or regional demand for goat meat and milk, along with proximity to marketplaces, urban centres or shandies will be prioritized to ensure income viability for SHG members.

III. Selection of Panchayats

i) Selection Committee

For establishment of goat rearing cluster in the district, **a district-level selection committee** will be formed to choose the most suitable panchayat. The committee will include:

- a. Project Director, Mathi
- b. Assistant Project Officer (Livelihood)
- c. District Resource Person (Farm)
- d. Block Mission Managers
- e. Representative from Animal Husbandry department.

ii) Selection Criteria of Panchayats

- a. Panchayats where SHGs are **already engaged in goat farming**, as they will have the necessary skills and knowledge on goat rearing.
- b. Panchayats where SHGs are already familiar with income-generating activities related to livestock and show interest and willingness to engage in goat farming and are open to forming goat rearing clusters for collective farming.
- c. Panchayats that are close to urban centres, markets, or large retail hubs to ensure that the goat products (meat, skin, blood, etc.) can be easily sold.
- d. Panchayats having accessibility of roads and transportation systems to ensure that the products can reach the markets efficiently without excessive costs.

e. Panchayats that are **near to veterinary hospitals or clinics** to ensure that the goat rearing clusters have ready access to animal health services

IV. Selection of Beneficiaries

- a. A **meeting** will be conducted **at the panchayat level** involving representatives from PLF and Community Resource Person (Farm),
 - i. To explain the project objectives, guidelines, and expected outcomes of the goat rearing cluster initiative.
 - ii. To highlight the benefits of goat rearing cluster as a viable incomegenerating activity.
 - iii. To encourage participation and address queries or concerns from potential beneficiaries.
- b. Once the meeting is conducted, application needs to be obtained from the SHG members interested in taking goat rearing cluster as livelihood activity.
- The PLF will keep the list of interested members and approve in the PLF meeting.
- d. For each cluster, select **20 women farmers** who are interested in goat rearing cluster from the same panchayat or from neighbouring panchayats in the area.
- e. The details of selected beneficiaries to be placed in Grama Sabha and got approved.

i) General criteria for selection of Beneficiaries:

- a. Should be SHG member for **at least two years**.
- b. The beneficiary should not have NPA / overdue in any NRLM fund support.
- c. The beneficiary should not be the President, Secretary, Joint Secretary or Treasurer of PLF / BLF.

- d. The beneficiary **preferably not be book keeper, CST, CBC, DRP, BRP, BMM, BC or any other CRP**.
- e. There **should not be repetition of beneficiaries** under various farm livelihood schemes in the last five years.
- f. Priority may be given for those SHG members who are destitute, widow, SC, ST and poor and very poor in PIP list.

ii) Specific Criteria for selection of Beneficiaries

- a. 20 SHG women members preferably with minimum 10 cents own/lease land will be identified from each selected panchayat. If land is not available beneficiary has to make own arrangement like tie up with fodder growing cluster members or farmers, purchase of fodder, grazing etc.,
- b. SHG members who are having **minimum of 150 sq.ft space** nearby the house or surroundings for construction of goat shed should be selected
- c. Selected members should be willing to contribute minimum Rs.1000/as membership fee. The amount collected as member contribution may be used for administrative reasons which may be decided by the Cluster.
- d. Selected members must be willing to undergo structured training and adopt modern goat farming techniques to improve meat yield and quality, and profitability.
- e. In case of more women expressing interest for establishment of goat rearing cluster, priority should be given to those SHG members with prior experience in goat farming.

V. Formation of Cluster

- a. **A group of 20 SHG women farmers** interested / experienced in goat rearing from same panchayat will be integrated to form a Goat rearing cluster.
- b. The selected SHG members shall be formed into clusters for better access to resources, knowledge and market opportunities.

- c. Secretary and Treasurer to be elected by all 20 members of cluster to manage administrative, technical and accounting works of the cluster.
- d. A bank account to be opened in the nearby Indian Bank in the name
 `Panchayat Name as prefix TNSRLM Goat Rearing Cluster 2025.'
 (Ex.Kattur TNSRLM Goat Rearing Cluster 2025)

VI. Implementation Strategy

- a. Goats should be chosen **from local breeds** that are specifically suited to the region's climate, feed availability, and disease resistance. This ensures that the goats are more adaptable to local conditions, reducing mortality rates and increasing productivity.
- b. Members who have land must **collectively cultivate fodder crops** for goat feeding. This can include grasses, legumes, and other plants suitable for goat nutrition. Fodder cultivation will reduce dependency on external suppliers and ensure a steady, low-cost supply of feed.
- c. The cluster will **purchase concentrated feed in bulk,** ensuring all members have access to high-quality feed at a reasonable cost. This feed will be distributed equitably among the members based on the number of goats in their care.
- d. To protect against financial loss due to disease, accidents, or other unforeseen events, all goats within the cluster must be insured.
- e. Members will receive training on modern goat-rearing techniques through the DRP Farm and CFS trainer or SPARK already identified by VKP in coordination with the Animal Husbandry Department / KVKs. This training will include best practices for feeding, breeding, health care, and farm management, enabling members to increase productivity and profitability.
- f. Ensure that goats are **housed in clean environments** to promote healthy living conditions, and that the incubation space is maintained at optimum hygiene to reduce contamination risks.

- g. Vaccination and other necessary veterinary practices will be carried out collectively for all goats within the cluster. This approach ensures that all animals are protected against common diseases, promoting the overall health and productivity of the herd.
- h. The cluster should focus on **selling goats in bulk** to traders or at local markets, ensuring that the animals are sold at profitable prices. By collectively selling in bulk, members can negotiate better prices and secure better deals than they would individually.
- i. Goat droppings should not go to waste. Instead, it should be converted into organic manure. This manure can then be sold for additional income or used for members' own farming purposes, promoting a circular economy within the cluster.

j. Fund Release

- a) The amount shall be released from SMMU to DMMU.
- b) The **CRP-Farm** will verify and confirm the selection of office bearers and the opening of cluster's bank account.
- c) On receipt of fund from SMMU, **an implementation team** of APO (LH), BC LH and BMM concerned should visit the panchayat and ensure

formation of cluster with **20 women as per eligibility**, opening of bank account, availability of space for goat shed, land for fodder cultivation, readiness of all women, etc., and submit report to PD, Mathi in the format specified in annexure 2 and 3.

- d) On receipt of recommendation, DMMU should release 100% of fund allocated for Goat rearing cluster **to BLF within 7 days**.
- e) BLF should release the fund to Goat rearing cluster within 7 days, following the **execution of a tripartite agreement** between BLF (agreement model given in annexure 4), Cluster and the Beneficiary which consists clause stating
 - 1. Shall utilize the funds for Goat rearing in the designated village.
 - 2. To follow cluster approach for procurement of feed, and other inputs and aggregation, marketing in the Goat rearing cluster.
 - 3. To repay the loan with 6% interest, starting from the fourth month.
- f) Only the actual cost incurred for Goat rearing will be provided as a loan. If the incurred cost is less than the sanctioned amount, only the actual cost will be disbursed. Any additional cost beyond the sanctioned loan amount shall be borne by the beneficiary.
- g) Under this scheme **Rs.98,500/-** will be provided to each member as revolving fund for goat farming

IX. Training

A two-day hands-on training program will be organized for all identified 20 SHG members, covering the following key areas by DRP Farm and CFS trainer or SPARK already identified by VKP, in coordination with Animal Husbandry department or KVKs (suggestive topics) at an outlay of **Rs.20,000/- per cluster**.

- a. Breed selection suitable for their panchayat
- b. Housing and shed management
- c. Feeding practices and nutrition
- d. Disease prevention and health care
- e. Breeding techniques
- f. Waste management and hygienic practices
- g. Handling and care of new born kids.

X. Marketing Strategy

- a. **DSMS Manager** facilitate tie ups with Butchers, Meat shops, Restaurant, Hotels, Caterers for bulk purchase. Form B2B partnerships to sell live goats or processed meat directly.
- b. **DRP Farm** to facilitate partnership with small meat processors and cold chain suppliers.

XI. Loan Repayment

a. Loan repayment should be made at **6% interest rate** and deposited to the cluster bank account.

- b. A sum of **Rs.19.795 lakhs** should be repaid to the goat rearing cluster except the sum of Rs.20,500/- spent for training, exposure visit and registers.
- c. A **moratorium period of 3 months** is fixed during which only interest is to be repaid.
- d. Following the moratorium, repayments should be made in monthly instalments. The repayment amount, along with the applicable interest, should be paid on or **before the 5th of every month** to the cluster account.
- e. Repayments should be recorded in a cash Book and proper receipts should be given to the beneficiary. Repaid amount should be deposited promptly into the Cluster's bank account.
- f. From the Cluster account, the due amount (principal & interest) for that month should be transferred to the BLF Farm Cluster Account through ECS
- g. Repayment period may be upto a maximum of 18 months after the moratorium period.
- h. Repaid loan amount may be used as working capital for next year/season for the existing members up to **two more repayment cycles**.
- If existing members are not willing to continue goat rearing in the next season or for expansion, eligible new members who are interested in joining the cluster may be included after verification by the team consisting of BC (LH), BMM and APO (LH)
- j. If no SHG member in the panchayat is willing to take up goat rearing in later year or after two more repayment cycles ,BMMU with the approval from DMMU, should release the funds to a **new cluster** willing to take up goat rearing as a cluster activity.

XII. Monitoring & Evaluation

- a. **CRP (Farm)** will visit the cluster to monitor the maintenance of goats in good health and ensure **timely loan repayments** by the SHG members and deposit into the cluster's bank account.
- b. The name of the cluster, year, beneficiary details, internal loan given details, no. of goats procured, etc., is to be maintained by the PLF in the Livelihood register.
- c. **BMM, BC LH and zonal BC will inspect the cluster**, ensure regular meeting, and oversee the expenditure made, and income generated besides maintenance of registers.
- d. BLF also to maintain a register with the cluster name and year.
- e. **District Resource Person (Farm)** shall visit the cluster and offer **technical guidance**, assess health of the goat, breeding time etc.
- f. Assistant Project Officer LH shall conduct monthly inspections of the cluster for verification of registers and documents, review of fund utilization and repayment status and to ensure the revolving fund mechanism is functioning properly
- g. The Project Director, Mathi, shall randomly visit the operational cluster.
- h. **The PD, Mathi** should conduct **monthly review** on functioning, repayment and earnings of the Goat rearing cluster with APO (LH), DRP Farm, BMM and BC LH.
- Once in six months the cluster progress is to be reviewed in the convergence meeting with line departments chaired by the District Collector.

XIII. Expected Outcomes:

- a. By participating in goat rearing, SHG women will have consistent access to a source of income through the sale of goats, goat products (milk, meat, fiber), and related by-products (manure).
- b. The availability of goat products for meat and milk will contribute to better food security and nutritional balance at the household level, especially in areas with limited access to alternative sources of protein and dairy.
- c. With bulk production, the cluster can engage in collective sales of goats, ensuring better pricing and market reach through negotiated sales. This cooperative model will provide better bargaining power for SHG women.

XIV. Way Forward

- a. To encourage more SHG members to take up goat rearing as a viable income-generating activity, thereby promoting local employment and economic resilience in rural areas
- b. To promote inclusion of new members in the goat rearing cluster in the village with assured income.

- The Third Party is a beneficiary of the scheme, participating through her Self Help Group (SHG).

1.3 Third Party (Beneficiary) Shall:

- Utilize the funds strictly for the purposes they are meant for and shall not divert the funds for consumption or personal purposes.
- Repay the loan with 6% interest starting from the _____ month from the date of receiving funds from the Second Party and pay only interest during the _____ months.
- Properly maintain all assets acquired under the scheme and shall not sell or transfer them to outsiders without prior approval from the Second and First Parties.
- Participate in training, share production data, and allow inspections as required.
- Ensure cleanliness in _____ units, and follow standard protocols.

2. Duration

This Agreement shall remain in force till the repayment of loan unless extended by mutual consent or terminated earlier as per Clause 5.

3. Financial Terms

Disbursement and utilization of funds shall follow the installment structure detailed in Section 1.2.

All repayments with interest shall be made as per the repayment schedule.

Refer to Annexure A for repayment schedule.

4. Dispute Resolution

Disputes, if any, shall be resolved amicably at the Panchayat level first. If unresolved, they shall be escalated to the Block Level Federation under the TNSRLM.

5. Termination

This Agreement may be terminated:

- By mutual consent of all parties;
- By the First Party upon breach or non-performance by the Second or Third Party;
- By the Third Party upon return of all assets and repayment of funds as applicable, with 30 days written notice.

6. Miscellaneous

The Agreement does not constitute an employment or agency relationship.

All annexures, rules, guidelines, and communications relating to the scheme are binding components of this Agreement.
